STANDARD OF LIVING

- Given the impact of unemployment on people's lives, it is critical that unemployed people receive social welfare payments that ensure they can meet their needs.
- To that end Jobseekers payments must be fully restored and the age segregation introduced to Jobseekers Allowance payments reversed.
- Exempt people whose primary source of income is their social welfare payment from the additional charges introduced during the crisis.
- Increase Rent Supplement and HAP to realistic levels and scaleup the provision of social housing.
- Good career guidance must be provided to support unemployed people to make informed choices, access appropriate education and training, and ultimately get a decent job.
- Frontline staff must be trained to provide a world class service, a service that is built around the needs of the unemployed person.
- Participation in education, training and employment programmes must be by choice.
- Additional supports must be provided to support participation and better outcomes.
- Employment programmes must be designed as a stepping stone to a decent job.
- Re-invest in community based organisations to support their work with people experiencing social exclusion, people who are distant from the labour market.
- Maximise the creation of decent and sustainable jobs, jobs that pay a decent wage.
- Part-time work can be a meaningful option for unemployed people and should be facilitated through more supportive employment and social protection supports.
- Improve access to supports to make self-employment a more viable option for unemployed people.
- Hold a referendum to enshrine economic, social and cultural rights into the Constitution.
- Add socio-economic status as a ground into Ireland's equality legislation.
